

# Allegheny Youth Development



## About

Since 1994, Allegheny Youth Development has combined traditional academic support with social and emotional learning in an out-of-school-time setting to help hundreds of North Side youth break the cycle of poverty, crime, and joblessness.

## Opportunities

### *Academic Mentors*

Tutor one, two, or three designated students throughout an entire public school grading period. AYD asks academic mentors to study with their students for 90-minute sessions at least twice a week. Students bring their own study materials and homework assigned by their teachers.

### *Recreation Volunteers*

Teach or assist in AYD's free elective classes. Commitments usually range from nine to 18 weeks, with volunteers working two to four hours per week

### *Support Volunteers*

May serve in a wide range of capacities, including van drivers, office assistants, and custodial workers. This category offers the widest range of commitments and hours, although we do ask these volunteers to follow a set schedule.

## Garfield Community Farm

### **About**

Over the past decade Garfield Community Farm has been restoring nearly three acres of abandoned and degraded urban land to become one of Pittsburgh's most productive and active urban farms. Their primary focus is getting food to people in their neighborhood and they do this through regular donation to food pantries and conducting a CSA (vegetable subscription program) reserved for people living within one mile of the farm.
